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US TERMS JUMPER #2 (1 of 2)

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Your chosen colour palette of DK yarns. Customise as you please!

4mm crochet hook

Darning needle/Finishing needle

This pattern is written in US terms.

ABBREVIATIONS:

mc - magic circle.

hdc - half double crochet.

sc - single crochet.

st - stitch.

dc - double crochet.

ch - chain.

sl st - slip stitch.

fsc - foundation single crochet.

2hdc-cluster - two half double crochet cluster.

WHAT TO DO:

Creating the base of the jumper.

Start with an mc. (or ch3 and sl st to first chain).

ROUND 1: Ch3, 11dc into mc, sl st to join. (12)

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, hdc in same st. 2hdc in every stitch around. sl st to join. (24)

*The first 2 rounds create the base of your apple jumper.

ROUND 3: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, hdc in same space. 2hdc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp. *(2hdc-cluster, 2hdc-cluster, sk1 sp). *Repeat from to end of round. (24 clusters) sl st to join, Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

**Round 3 builds your cluster rows. Now to build the body.*

Creating the body of the jumper.

**This pattern has 4x rows of hdc height stitches that form the main body of the jumper. This was intentional, to give you enough rows to get creative with your own colour formations and to be able to create your own version!*

ROW 4: Join new colour yarn in the middle 'v' of your first group of 2 cluster stitches. Ch2, hdc, then 2hdc-cluster in same 'v' sp, (2hdc-cluster, 2hdc-cluster in next 'v' space between two clusters). Your 'v' clusters should stack on top of each other. Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st in final space before first cluster of R3. (this is will finish this row. DO NOT sl st to join. We are working rows and this will create the edge of the front seam of your cardigan.) Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

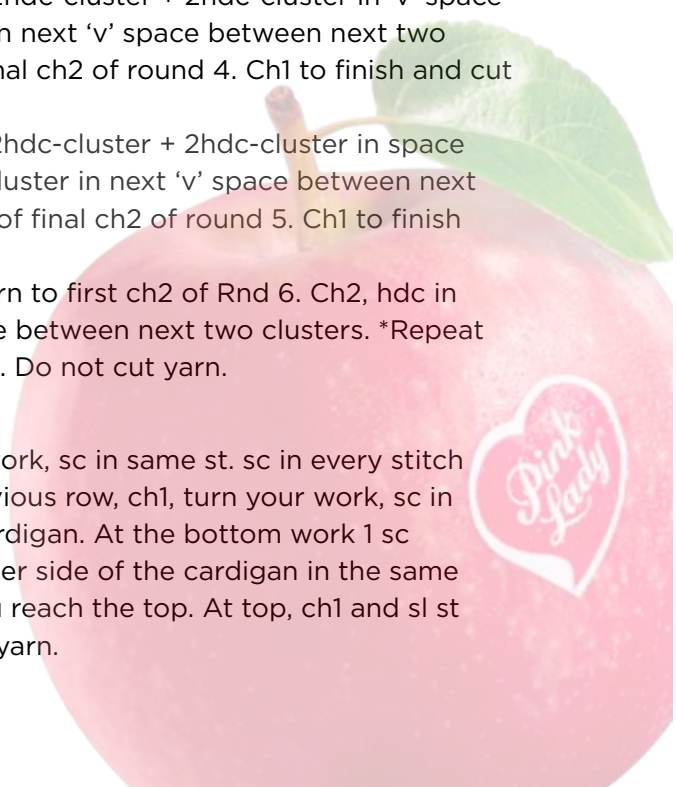
ROW 5: Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 4. Ch2. 2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in 'v' space of cluster from prev round. *2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 4. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROW 6: Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 5. Ch2. 2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in space between 'v' cluster of prev round. *2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 5. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROW 7: (Final round of hdc clusters.) Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 6. Ch2, hdc in same space. *2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 6. Do not cut yarn.

Creating the collar and front seams of cardigan.

ROW 8: Continue with same colour yarn. ch1, turn your work, sc in same st. sc in every stitch around to create collar. At final sc in top of ch2 from previous row, ch1, turn your work, sc in same st. Work 3sc over every ch2 down front seam of cardigan. At the bottom work 1 sc inbetween ch2 and hdc stitch, then work back up the other side of the cardigan in the same way, placing 3sc over every ch2 of the front seam, till you reach the top. At top, ch1 and sl st into 1st sc st of collar. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.



US TERMS JUMPER #2 (2 of 2)

MAKING THE SLEEVES

ROUND 1: To begin make a fsc row of 10 stitches. (or chain 11, single crochet into second chain from the hook and work a row of sc into every stitch) Join with a slip st and Ch1 to finish. Use your tail to join the last chain with the first ch. (10)
Now to work in the round...

ROUND 2: Join new colour yarn. Ch2, hdc in same space, 2hdc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp, In next space, *2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in space between two stitches, sk1 sp. *Repeat to end of round. (10 clusters) Sl st to close and Ch1 to finish, cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 3: Join new colour yarn in 'v' of any cluster. Ch2, hdc in same space, 2hdc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp, In next stitch space, *2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster in 'v' space of cluster of previous round, sk1 sp. *Repeat to end of round. (10 clusters) Sl st to close and Ch1 to finish, cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 4: Join new colour yarn in 'v' of any cluster. Ch2, hdc in same space, 2hdc-cluster in same space. *In next 'v' space, 2hdc-cluster + 2hdc-cluster. *Repeat from to end of round. (10 clusters). Sl st to close, **DO NOT** cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: (Sleeve cuff) Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1 and sc in same st. sc in every stitch around. (10). Sl st into first sc to close the round, Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.
*NB: The sc row will tighten the cuff, this is the desired finish to the sleeve.

**Make 2x sleeves the same. Align row colour to main body of jumper. Squeeze top of sleeve edges together and join both edges to cardigan at same time with darning needle. Push loose ends up into sleeve. Alternatively leave top of sleeve open and attach using whichever method you prefer.*

FINISHING TOUCHES

*Using a darning needle, and same colour yarn, join front seams of cardigan together, leaving 4sc stitch depth at top of each front seam to allow for collar opening.
Finish with a small pink button for that extra finishing 'touch'.*

SPECIAL STITCHES

2hdc-cluster:

A 2-half-double-crochet cluster (2hdc cluster) is made by working two unfinished half double crochets together into a designated space or stitch, leaving you with three loops on your hook before pulling through all of them at once.

Step-by-Step Instructions

FIRST CLUSTER.

STEP ONE: One loop on your hook. Yarn over (yo), insert your hook into the specified stitch or space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (3 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (2x loops left on your hook)

STEP TWO: Yarn over again, insert your hook into the same space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (4 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (3x loops left on your hook)

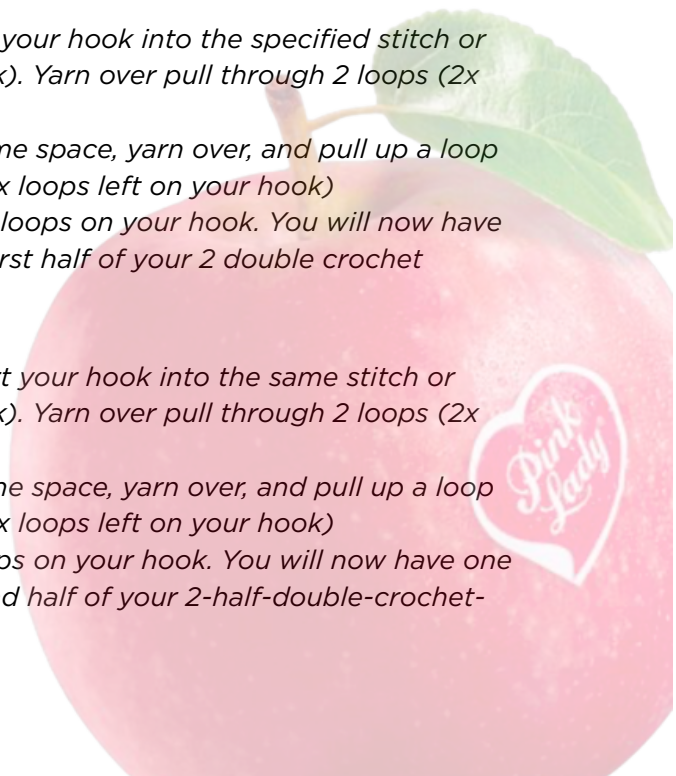
STEP THREE: Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops on your hook. You will now have one loop on left your hook and will have completed the first half of your 2 double crochet cluster (2hdc-cl).

SECOND CLUSTER.

STEP FOUR: One loop on your hook. Yarn over (yo), insert your hook into the same stitch or space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (3 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (2x loops left on your hook)

STEP FIVE: Yarn over again, insert your hook into the same space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (4 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (3x loops left on your hook)

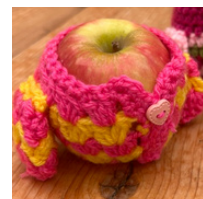
STEP SIX: Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops on your hook. You will now have one loop on left your hook and will have completed the second half of your 2-half-double-crochet-cluster. (2hdc-cl).



UK TERMS JUMPER #2 (1 of 2)

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Your chosen colour palette of DK yarns
4mm crochet hook
Darning needle/Finishing needle



This pattern is written in UK terms.

ABBREVIATIONS:

mc - magic circle.	tr - treble crochet.
htc - half treble crochet.	ch - chain.
dc - double crochet.	sl st - slip stitch.
st - stitch.	fdc - foundation double crochet.
	2htc-cluster - two half treble crochet cluster.

WHAT TO DO:

Creating the base of the jumper.

Start with an mc. (or ch3 and sl st to first chain).

ROUND 1: Ch3, 11tr into mc, sl st to join. (12)

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, htc in same st. 2htc in every stitch around. sl st to join. (24)

*The first 2 rounds create the base of your apple jumper.

ROUND 3: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, htc in same space. 2htc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp. *(2htc-cluster, 2htc-cluster, sk1 sp). *Repeat from to end of round. (24 clusters) sl st to join and Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

*Round 3 builds your cluster rows. Now to build the body.

ROW 4: Join new colour yarn in the middle 'v' of your first group of 2 cluster stitches. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

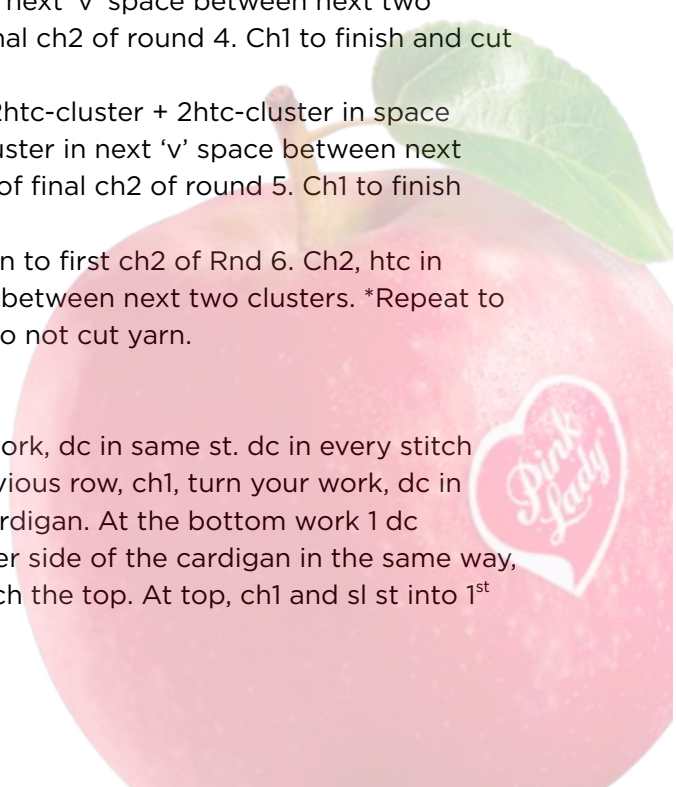
ROW 5: Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 4. Ch2. 2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in 'v' space of cluster from prev round. *2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 4. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROW 6: Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 5. Ch2. 2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in space between 'v' cluster of prev round. *2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 5. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROW 7: (Final round of htc clusters.) Join new colour yarn to first ch2 of Rnd 6. Ch2, htc in same space. *2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in next 'v' space between next two clusters. *Repeat to end of round. Ch2, sl st into top of final ch2 of round 6. Do not cut yarn.

Creating the collar and front seams of cardigan.

ROW 8: Continue with same colour yarn. ch1, turn your work, dc in same st. dc in every stitch around to create collar. At final dc in top of ch2 from previous row, ch1, turn your work, dc in same st. Work 3dc over every ch2 down front seam of cardigan. At the bottom work 1 dc inbetween ch2 and htc stitch, then work back up the other side of the cardigan in the same way, placing 3dc over every ch2 of the front seam, till you reach the top. At top, ch1 and sl st into 1st dc st of collar. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.



UK TERMS JUMPER #2 (2 of 2)

MAKING THE SLEEVES

ROUND 1: To begin make a fdc row of 10 stitches. (or chain 11, double crochet into second chain from the hook and work a row of dc into every stitch) Join with a slip st. Use your tail to join the last chain with the first ch. (10)

Now to work in the round...

ROUND 2: Join new colour yarn. Ch2, htc in same space, 2htc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp, In next space, *2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in space between two stitches, sk1 sp. *Repeat to end of round. (10 clusters) Sl st to close and Ch1 to finish, cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 3: Join new colour yarn in 'v' of any cluster. Ch2, htc in same space, 2htc-cluster in same space, sk1 sp, In next stitch space, *2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster in 'v' space of cluster of previous round, sk1 sp. *Repeat to end of round. (10 clusters) Sl st to close and Ch1 to finish, cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 4: Join new colour yarn in 'v' of any cluster. Ch2, htc in same space, 2htc-cluster in same space. *In next 'v' space, 2htc-cluster + 2htc-cluster. *Repeat from to end of round. (10 clusters). Sl st to close, DO NOT cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: (Sleeve cuff) Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1 and dc in same st. dc in every stitch around. (10). Sl st into first dc to close the round, Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

*NB: The dc row will tighten the cuff, this is the desired finish to the sleeve.

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Finish with a small pink button for that extra finishing 'touch'.

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A 2-half-treble-crochet cluster (2htc cluster) is made by working two unfinished half treble crochets together into a designated space or stitch, leaving you with three loops on your hook before pulling through all of them at once.

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STEP TWO: Yarn over again, insert your hook into the same space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (4 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (3x loops left on your hook)

STEP THREE: Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops on your hook. You will now have one loop on left your hook and will have completed the first half of your 2 treble crochet cluster (2htc-cl).

SECOND CLUSTER.

STEP FOUR: One loop on your hook. Yarn over (yo), insert your hook into the same stitch or space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (3 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (2x loops left on your hook)

STEP FIVE: Yarn over again, insert your hook into the same space, yarn over, and pull up a loop (4 loops on your hook). Yarn over pull through 2 loops (3x loops left on your hook)

STEP SIX: Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops on your hook. You will now have one loop on left your hook and will have completed the second half of your 2-half-treble-crochet-cluster. (2htc-cl).
