ZIG ZAG JUMPER



SKILL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE-ADVANCED

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US TERMS JUMPER #3 (1 of 2)

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Your chosen colour palette of DK yarns
4mm crochet hook
Darning needle/Finishing needle



This pattern is written in US terms.

ABBREVIATIONS:

mc - magic circle. dc - double crochet.
hdc - half double crochet. ch - chain.
sc - single crochet. sl st - slip stitch.
st - stitch. sp-dc - spike double crochet stitch (sp-tr - spike treble crochet)
fsc - foundation single crochet.

WHAT TO DO:

Creating the base of the jumper.

Start with an mc. (or ch3 and sl st to first chain).

ROUND 1: Ch3, 11dc into mc, sl st to join. (12)

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, 2hdc in every stitch around. sl st to join. (24)

ROUND 3: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, hdc in same st, (hdc, hdc, 2hdc) repeat to end of round. Sl st to join. (32)

**The first 3 rounds create the base of your apple jumper. Now to build the body and sleeves.*

Creating the body of the jumper.

ROUND 4: Setting up the round. Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, 2hdc in same st, *sk2 st, 3hdc. *Repeat from to end of round. (33 sts). To finish, ch1 and sl st to first ch3 to join, ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: Join new colour yarn in any ch sp between 3hdc. Ch2, 1sp-dc into 1st sk-st of round below, hdc in space. *In next space (hdc, sp-dc, hdc), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 6: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1 sp-dc into middle hdc stitch of prev round below, hdc in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc, sp-dc, hdc), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 7: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (hdc, sp-dc, hdc). Ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc in space, sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 8: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc in space, sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 9: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (hdc, sp-dc, hdc). Ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc in space, sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 10: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc in space, sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 11: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (hdc, sp-dc, hdc). Ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (hdc in space, sp-dc into sp-dc stitch below, hdc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 12: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, sc in same stitch. Sc in every stitch around. (33) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.



US TERMS JUMPER #3 (2 of 2)

Creating the collar.

ROUND 11: Join new colour yarn in any sc stitch. Ch1, sc in same st. Sc in every stitch around. (33) Sl st to join.

ROUND 12: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch3, dc in same stitch, hdc in next, sc all the way around till you have 3 stitches left. Hdc in 3rd stitch from end, (dc, ch3) in second stitch from end. Slip stitch back into same stitch to finish the collar. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

You should have one unworked stitch left at the centre 'v' of your collar points.

*Turn your jumper inside out, weave your ends to the inside of jumper.

MAKING THE SLEEVES

ROUND 1: To begin make a fsc row of 10 stitches. (or chain 11, single crochet into second chain from the hook and work a row of sc into every stitch) Join with a slip st. Use your tail to join the last chain with the first ch. (10)

Now to work in the round...

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, sc in every stitch around. (10) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 3: Join new colour yarn in any sc stitch. Ch2, 1sp-dc into space between the two single crochet stitches below, hdc in the sc stitch directly behind the 1sp-dc just worked, (You are creating a bell shaped sleeve so we need to increase the stitch count) Continue around hdc, (1sp-dc in row below, hdc in sc behind the 1sp-dc just worked) (15) Join with a slip st.

ROUND 4: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, sc in every stitch around. (15) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: Join new colour yarn in sc above the hdc of round 3 (the sp-dc should be sitting to the right of your join). Ch2, 1sp-dc between the two sc of round 3, hdc in next st, hdc in next.

*1sp-dc in between the two sc of round 3, (2 rows below) hdc in next st, hdc in next. *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 6: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, sc in every stitch around. (15) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

(The stitch formation of rounds 3-6 are to make your sleeves appear to have the same stitch as the body of the jumper)

ROUND 7: Join new colour yarn in any st. Ch1, sc in every stitch around. (15) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

*Make 2x bell shaped sleeves the same. *Turn your sleeves inside out, weave in your ends. Align sleeve row colour to main body of jumper, flatten top of sleeve edges together and join both edges to cardigan at same time with darning needle. Alternatively leave top of sleeve open and attach using whichever method you prefer.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Double Crochet Spike Stitch: sp-dc

The crochet spike stitch is a decorative technique where you work an elongated stitch into a row or rows below the current working row. You draw up a loop to the height of the working row (no matter if you insert your hook one or several rows below), creating a long vertical "spike".

Step-by-Step Instructions

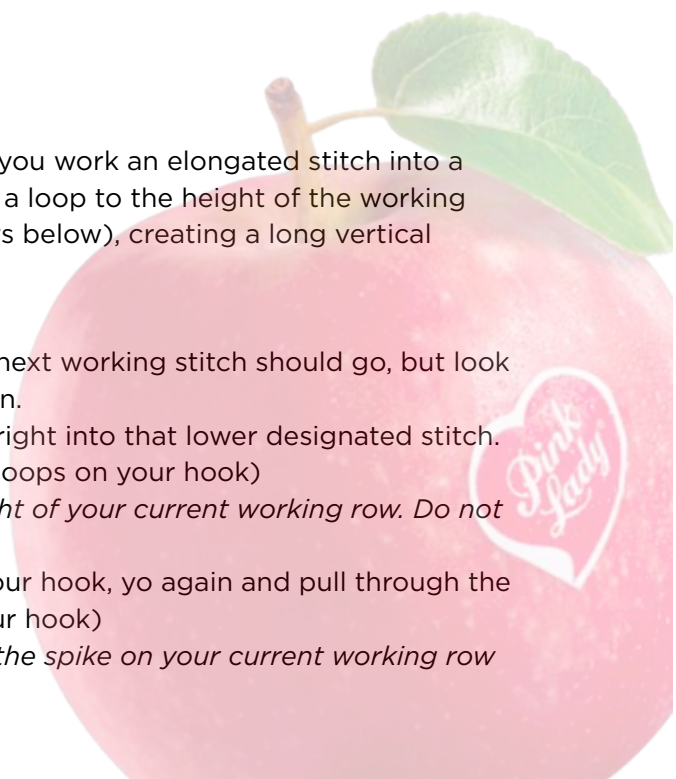
STEP ONE: Identify the stitch directly below where your next working stitch should go, but look one, two, or three rows down, as specified by your pattern.

STEP TWO: Yarn over (yo) and insert your crochet hook right into that lower designated stitch. Yarn over and pull a loop back up through your work. (3 loops on your hook)

NB. Pull that loop up loosely so it matches the exact height of your current working row. Do not pull too tight, or it will pucker your work.

STEP THREE: Yarn over and pull through two loops on your hook, yo again and pull through the last two loops to finish the double crochet. (1 loop on your hook)

NB. Skip the corresponding stitch directly behind/above the spike on your current working row and continue to work your next stitch.



UK TERMS JUMPER #3 (1 of 2)

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Your chosen colour palette of DK yarns
4mm crochet hook
Darning needle/Finishing needle



This pattern is written in UK terms.

ABBREVIATIONS:

mc - magic circle.	tr - treble crochet.
htc - half treble crochet.	ch - chain.
dc - double crochet.	sl st - slip stitch.
st - stitch.	sp-tr - spike treble crochet stitch
fdc - foundation double crochet.	

WHAT TO DO:

Creating the base of the jumper.

Start with an mc. (or ch3 and sl st to first chain).

ROUND 1: Ch3, 11tr into mc, sl st to join. (12)

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, 2htc in every stitch around. sl st to join. (24)

ROUND 3: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, htc in same st, (htc, htc, 2htc) repeat to end of round. Sl st to join. (32)

**The first 3 rounds create the base of your apple jumper. Now to build the body and sleeves.*

Creating the body of the jumper.

ROUND 4: Setting up the round. Continue with same colour yarn. Ch2, 2htc in same st, *sk2 st, 3htc. *Repeat from to end of round. (33 sts). To finish, ch1 and sl st to first ch3 to join, ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: Join new colour yarn in any ch sp between 3htc. Ch2, 1sp-tr into 1st sk-st of round below, htc in space. *In next space (htc, sp-tr, htc), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 6: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1 sp-tr into middle htc stitch of prev round below, htc in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc, sp-tr, htc), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 7: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (htc, sp-tr, htc). Ch2, 1sp-dc into sp-tr stitch below, htc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc in space, sp-dc into sp-tr stitch below, htc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 8: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc in space, sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 9: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (htc, sp-tr, htc). Ch2, 1sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc in space, sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 10: Continue with same colour yarn. Sl st round to nxt space. ch2, 1sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc in space, sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 11: Join new colour yarn in any sp between (htc, sp-tr, htc). Ch2, 1sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc, in same space. *Move along to next sp. (htc in space, sp-tr into sp-tr stitch below, htc in same space), *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

ROUND 12: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, dc in same stitch. Dc in every stitch around. (33) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.



UK TERMS JUMPER #3 (2 of 2)

Creating the collar.

ROUND 11: Join new colour yarn in any dc stitch. Ch1, dc in same st. Dc in every stitch around. (33) Sl st to join.

ROUND 12: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch3, tr in same stitch, htc in next, sc all the way around till you have 3 stitches left. Htc in 3rd stitch from end, (tr, ch3) in second stitch from end. Slip stitch back into same stitch to finish the collar. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn. You should have one unworked stitch left at the centre 'v' of your collar points.

*Turn your jumper inside out, weave your ends to the inside of jumper.

MAKING THE SLEEVES

ROUND 1: To begin make a fdc row of 10 stitches. (or chain 11, single crochet into second chain from the hook and work a row of dc into every stitch) Join with a slip st. Use your tail to join the last chain with the first ch. (10)

Now to work in the round...

ROUND 2: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, dc in every stitch around. (10) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 3: Join new colour yarn in any sc stitch. Ch2, 1sp-tr into space between the two double crochet stitches below, htc in the dc stitch directly behind the 1sp-tr just worked, (You are creating a bell shaped sleeve so we need to increase the stitch count) Continue around htc, (1sp-tr in row below, htc in dc behind the 1sp-tr just worked) (15) Join with a slip st.

ROUND 4: Continue with same colour yarn. Ch1, dc in every stitch around. (15) Sl st to join. Ch1 to finish and cut your colour of yarn.

ROUND 5: Join new colour yarn in dc above the htc of round 3 (the sp-tr should be sitting to the right of your join). Ch2, 1sp-tr between the two dc of round 3, htr in next st, htc in next.

*1sp-tr in between the two dc of round 3, (2 rows below) htc in next st, htc in next. *Repeat from to end of round. sl st to join.

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NB. Pull that loop up loosely so it matches the exact height of your current working row. Do not pull too tight, or it will pucker your work.

STEP THREE: Yarn over and pull through two loops on your hook, yo again and pull through the last two loops to finish the treble crochet. (1 loop on your hook)

NB. Skip the corresponding stitch directly behind/above the spike on your current working row and continue to work your next stitch.
